Connecting

During our Diocesan Convention in November, Bishop Paula shared that one of her priorities is to foster connections within the Diocese. Specifically, she talked about creating opportunities for clergy to connect with one another, and encouraged clergy and parishes to do more connecting and working together. For a variety of reasons, that message



resonated with me, and I've been thinking about it ever since.

Clergy are prone to feeling isolated in their work. Many work with very minimal staff and no other clergy in their churches, simply due to their size. Often, the nearest Episcopal Church is several miles away, and many regional groups don't meet very often. It can be lonely work.

The way our church polity is structured, each parish is seen as an individual unit which is meant to be self-supporting. Many parishes are hesitant to engage in partnering in ministry with other churches, which they perceive as a weakness. "We can't do this thing on our own" easily induces guilt or shame. For some, partnering is seen as threatening - "What if people start going to the *other* church?" These, and many other factors, can lead to parishes viewing themselves and behaving like their own little islands.

So why am I talking about this? And what does it have to do with Advent and Christmas? Glad you asked!

Because I believe that this idea of connection is at the heart of everything - God, the universe, the natural world, humanity, reality itself in all its forms - literally everything. Nothing in reality exists in isolation - everything is connected.

One way to look at the Incarnation (en-flesh-ment) is that God was connecting to us in a fresh way in Jesus. He came to us as a human being and lived among us - "moved into the neighborhood" - to demonstrate that God is connected to us, and we are connected to God. Not "can be," but are. It is a reality; it is already so. What Jesus does is invite us

into consciously living in this reality of connection with God. Anytime we live consciously in this connection - to ourselves, to others and to God - we are living in reality. When we live as if we are disconnected from ourselves, from others and from God, we are actually living in an illusion - or delusion.

The truth is, if everything is connected, we need each other in order to thrive. The very life energy of God - what we might call the Holy Spirit - flows through these connections. Our deeply-embedded cultural myth of rugged individualism and self-sufficiency is an illusion. It ends up creating isolated and lonely people.

So to bring this back to where I started, I am blessed and we are blessed by the connections we foster here at St. Andrew's. I am fortunate to have clergy colleagues right here, plus an amazing and dedicated staff. We have an active Deanery (smaller geographic unit of the Diocese), and the clergy meet monthly to share prayer, ideas, Diocesan business, and fellowship. I am involved in mentoring newer clergy in the Diocese, which keeps me connected to the vibrancy of newer clergy and allows me to offer whatever wisdom I might share. I am a better priest and person because of these connections.

As a parish, we foster a lot of connections, too. We are in partnership with four other local churches through the Community Kitchen, which provides a lovingly prepare meal every day of the week to our unhoused and hungry neighbors here in Downers Grove. We partner with the Church of the Holy Nativity in Clarendon Hills in two ways now - the Pumpkin Patch and our Youth Ministry. Our Parents' Day Out program connects us to our surrounding neighborhoods. Not to mention all the myriad ways we foster connections within our own faith community here at St. Andrew's.

God made the divine/human connection real in the person of Jesus, and that's what we celebrate at Christmas. Let's keep the energy of God's love flowing through all the ways we are connected to each other in our families and friends, our church, in our community, and in the natural world. It's how God designed it to be!

MOTHER TARA'S KENYA TRIP

I am excited to announce I will travel to Nairobi, Kenya, in January to take part in a clergy exchange program called Karibu Ministries (https:// www.diowis.org/news/karibu-ministries). Karibu aims to share resources between the Episcopal Church and the Anglican Church of Kenya (ACK) by facilitating training sessions for clergy on both continents. The learning is reciprocal: U.S. clergy travel to Kenya to teach formal seminary-type courses in leadership and management, while the Kenyan clergy give the Americans insight into the exponential growth of the church happening in East Africa. Kenyan clergy also travel to the U.S. twice each year. Church attendance declines in the U.S., but the opposite is true in Kenya. The ACK now boasts nearly 6 million members nationwide, about 10 percent of the population. They are increasing by 7% per year! I aim to crack the code of their success while I'm there and bring some strategies home to Downers Grove.






From January 13th-22nd, I will co-lead a new initiative for Youth Ministers, followed by a three-day session for parish priests. I will be in the Diocese of Nairobi and the nearby Diocese of Machakos. The trip is fully funded by Karibu Ministries, which was started a few years ago by the Rev. Canon Martin Olando Wesonga, Canon to the Ordinary in the Diocese of Machakos, and Fr. Rob Davis of St. Boniface Episcopal Church in Mequon, Wisconsin. The two priests met on a pilgrimage to the Holy Land in 2019 and decided they needed to build a bridge between the clergy in their two home countries. The program is growing each year, and this will be the 7th U.S. mission to Kenya, while the 4th mission from Kenya to the U.S. is happening this month in Wisconsin.

DID YOU KNOW?

Planned Giving - St Andrew's receives quarterly dividends from 3 Endowments - the CA Young Trust, the St. Andrews Trust, and the Catherine Morse Endowment. The Catherine Morse Endowment is probably new to you, but it's the first and by far the oldest



and has contributed the most to our church. In 1907, through generous Planned Giving, parishioner Catherine Morse gave the Bishop of Chicago \$2000 to establish an endowment for the long-term benefit of St. Andrews. As part of the Bishop's Trust Fund, that gift is today invested in the Diocesan Foundation's Common Fund (the same fund that manages St. Andrews' 2 other trusts) and pays quarterly dividends of \$2000 to our church; roughly the same dividend amount we receive from the other 2 investments. That's right - a \$2000 gift in 1907 can continuously generate a

\$2000 quarterly dividend today that will continue to increase in the years ahead; a wonderful example of the power of Planned Giving. Later in Crosscurrents, read the fascinating, inspiring details of this wonderful parishioner whose Planned Giving has benefited St. Andrews for the last 118 years.

Smart Giving - Want to save on your income taxes while you help St. Andrews? Recent changes to the federal income tax laws encourage year end charitable giving by allowing you to claim up to a \$2000 (for joint filers) deduction or \$1000 (for a single tax payer) deduction for charitable contributions up to these amounts even if you don't itemize your deductions. This means you can help St. Andrews now with a 2025 contribution or by prepaying a portion of your 2026 pledge. It's also a great time to help St. Andrews with any remaining 2025 RMD dollars (required minimum distributions for those 73 or older) or tax smart gifts from those eligible to take advantage of QCDs (qualified charitable donations).

Power of Prayer - in the November Crosscurrents, you read about the plight of William Gonzalez - a parishioner of St. Paul and the Redeemer who was wrongfully detained by ICE in their Baldwin Michigan facility where he was visited by Bishop Clark. On Oct 30th, a federal judge ordered his release and ruled against ICE's indefinite detainment of Mr. Gonzalez. While Mr. Gonzalez's legal saga isn't over, he's no longer in custody and able to rejoin his family and church.

Celebration Sunday - many thanks to everyone who brought their favorite pie(s) to share on Celebration Sunday. We enjoyed over a dozen different types of pies - all types of fruit and nut pies and even pork pies. We had enough to share with our Community Kitchen guests on Sunday as well as on the following Friday, Nov 21.


